the role of voluntary standards in commerce and the many industry and government volunteers who help create them.

This year, the American National Standard Institute (ANSI) will sponsor a full week of meetings, forums and symposia, culminating in the US Celebration of World Standards Day on November 7.

ECIA supports a robust standards program which produces standards for the domestic and international markets. Many ECIA member companies participate in 13 ECIA-managed US Technical Advisory Groups to the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) and 13 US domestic Standards Committees.

Serving on a <u>standards committee</u> is an excellent way to get your voice heard, particularly in areas of cutting technology. The 36-country Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) estimates standards and trade regulations affect over eighty percent of world trade and commerce.

### **GIPC Meets in Chicago**

Directly following the ECIA Executive Conference, the GIPC (Global Industry Practices Council) met to review 2019 and map out direction for 2020. One key initiative is to improve overall communication of Committee work.

#### Areas of Committee involvement:

- In response to recent announcements on tariff exclusions from the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, the GIPC is working on a brief guidance document to assist member companies on navigating the exclusion process.
- The GIPC will begin exploring Free Trade Zone (FTZ) warehousing. The Committee will determine the scope of the project and begin the recruitment of Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) to participate in a working group scheduled to start in Q1, 2020. Please contact Don Elario or more information.
- The Committee wants to improve their ability to react timely, as well as anticipate industry issues with the ECIA Board and Councils. Teri Ivaniszyn, VP Operational Excellence, Digi-Key Electronics and current Chairperson of the GIPC, along with other members of the committee are working on ways to streamline the process and improve overall project management.
